

Grant Opportunities and Updates

Robert Wood Johnson Foundation | Health Policy Research Scholars program Deadline: March 15, 2023. The four-year national leadership development program provides support for full-time doctoral students from nonclinical, research-focused disciplines in which policy is a key driver of change (e.g., urban planning; political science; economics; anthropology; education; social work; sociology; engineering; geography; and lab/bench sciences) whose aim is to improve health, well-being, and equity; challenge longstanding, entrenched systems; exhibit new ways of working; collaborate across disciplines and sectors; and bolster their leadership skills. 40 scholars will be selected to receive an annual stipend of \$30,000 for up to four years or until they complete their doctoral program (whichever is sooner). Home institutions may include an administrative fee of \$1,000 per year, \$4,000 in total to the grant amount to cover the administrative costs of managing the award.

OSEP (Office of Special Education Programs): Technical Assistance and Dissemination to Improve Services and Results for Children with Disabilities: Center on Dispute Resolution Deadline: April 4, 2023, by 11:59 PM ET. The purpose of the Technical Assistance and Dissemination to Improve Services and Results for Children with Disabilities program is to promote academic achievement and to improve results for children with disabilities by providing TA, supporting model demonstration projects, disseminating useful information, and implementing activities that are supported by scientifically based research. Award Ceiling: \$750,000.

USDA | Secondary Education, Two-Year Postsecondary Education, and Agriculture in the K-12 Classroom Challenge Grants Program Deadline: April 5, 2023, by 11:59 PM ET. (SPECA) program seeks to: (a) promote and strengthen secondary education and two-year postsecondary education in the food and agriculture sciences in order to help ensure the existence of a workforce in the United States that's qualified to serve the food and agriculture sciences system; and (b) promote complementary and synergistic linkages among secondary, two-year postsecondary, and higher education programs in the food and agriculture sciences in order to advance excellence in education and encourage more young Americans to pursue and complete a baccalaureate or higher degree in the food and agriculture sciences. Funding amount: Regular Grant: \$50K; Collaborative Type 1 Grant: \$150K. Grant Duration: 24-36 months.

FDA OMHHE Racial & Ethnic minority Acceleration Consortium for Health Equity (REACH) Deadline: April 6, 2023, by 11:59 PM ET. Research Projects will be projects that are well integrated to support advancing health equity for racial and ethnic minority populations. Research projects should be organized around advancing communications, research,

trainings and collaborations on diseases and conditions that impact racial and ethnic minority populations. Funding amount: from \$50K to \$500K.

CDC | Drug-Free Communities (DFC) Support Program- NEW (Year 1) Deadline: April 11, 2023. The purpose of the DFC Support Program is to establish and strengthen collaborations to support the efforts of community coalitions working to prevent and reduce substance use among youth. The DFC Support Program has two goals: 1) Establish and strengthen the collaboration among communities, public and private non-profit agencies, as well as federal, state, local, and tribal governments to support the efforts of community coalitions working to prevent and reduce substance use among youth (individuals 18 years of age and younger). 2) Reduce substance use among youth and, over time, reduce substance use among adults by addressing the factors in a community that increases the risk of substance use and promoting the factors that minimize the risk of substance use. Funding amount: up to \$125K per budget period. Eligible applicants are community-based coalitions addressing youth substance use that have not yet previously received a DFC grant.

DRL FY2022: Leveraging Intersectionality to Ensure Zero Obstruction to Women's Empowerment Department of State Bureau of Democracy Human Rights and Labor Deadline: March 22, 2023. An open competition for organizations interested in submitting applications for projects that protect and defend the universal human rights, fundamental freedoms, and dignity of all individuals, including those who experience violence, discrimination, and marginalization based on multiple and overlapping social identities. Funding: \$1M for 18-24 months.

Research Grants in the Arts, FY2024 National Endowment for the Arts Deadline: March 27, 2023. The four priority topics are: The art's impact on health, education, and the economy; The art's role in community transformation and healing; Diversity, equity, inclusion, and accessibility in the arts; The evolving ecosystem of the arts in the U.S. Award Ceiling: \$100,000.

NSF Partnerships for Innovation | Deadline May 2, 2023. PFI- Technology Translation (PFI-TT) track offers the opportunity to translate prior NSF-funded research results in any field of science or engineering into technological innovations with promising commercial potential and societal impact. PFI-TT supports commercial potential demonstration projects for academic research outputs in any NSF-funded science and engineering discipline. (PFI-TT) will be funded for up to \$550,000 for 18-24 months per award; approximately 15-35 awards are anticipated. PFI-Research Partnerships (PFI-RP) projects will be funded for up to \$1,000,000 for 36 months; approximately 10-20 awards are anticipated.

NIJ FY23 Research and Evaluation on the Administration of Justice: Advancing Access to Justice 60 Years after Gideon Application JustGrants, Deadline: May 10, 2023, at 8:59 p.m. ET. NIJ seeks to support rigorous research and evaluation projects examining the impact of court and other criminal justice tools, practices and policies on the administration of justice and public safety in state, local and tribal jurisdictions. With the 60th anniversary of Gideon v. Wainwright, 372 U.S. 335 (1963), and in collaboration with DOJ's Office for Access to Justice, NIJ's research priority under this solicitation in FY2023 is public defense or indigent defense services and equitable access to justice.
